Autonomy

- Teams are empowered to make most decisions about:
 - · User Stories to work on for each Sprint
 - How work is allocated among team members
 - Volunteering to add User Stories to Sprint when ending early
 - Sequencing of work items
 - Coordination and Communication within team
 - Improving processes and methods discovered in Retrospectives

Transparency

- Teams communicate their status to all on a regular basis:
 - All agree on a common Definition of Done
 - Sprint Plans and all User Stories published to entire team
 - User Stories updated after daily Stand-up
 - · Burndown status updated daily
 - · Impediments discussed at daily Stand-up
 - Upper Management may inspect status during or after Sprint is over
 - Team Velocity is measured and published to all

BIR – Big Information Radiator

- Teams use a "Big Information Radiator" to show status
 - Can be a wall or board with Sticky Notes
 - Status of all User Stories for a Sprint are displayed (Not Started, In-Progress, Done)
 - Can also be implemented in software (Team Concert, JIRA, Team Foundation Server, etc., etc.)
 - Can be shared across Sprint Teams





Overseeing Vendors doing SCRUM

- Sprint Planning monitor that story points are allocated in orderly manner and defects added to backlog
- Daily Stand-up expect daily updates to Sprint Backlog
- Product Backlog review at end of each Sprint
- Sprint Review participate personally and ensure delivery of all items in the Plan are delivered to the satisfaction of the Business Users
- Sprint Retrospective monitor for process improvement measures
- Team Velocity expect gradual improvement, but may be bumps in the road
